ABOUT BUFFALO LAKE METIS SETTLEMENT

Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement is located in the northwest of the Alberta HUB region. Alberta HUB is a partnership of municipalities, First Nations, Metis Settlements, post-secondary educational institutions, and business/industry in northeastern Alberta meant to enhance the quality of life and economic interests of this region. Buffalo Lake is one of eight Métis Settlements in Alberta with a land base that is comprised of 35,356 hectares (3.75 Townships) and has a population of 702 (2018) people (on reserve/crown land). Buffalo Lake is located 200 km northeast of Edmonton and 50 kilometres southwest of Lac La Biche, other towns nearby are Boyle and Smoky Lake.

Oil & Gas

Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement is strategically located for the oil/gas industry with its proximity to the South Athabasca Oil Sands, which has production approval for 40,000 barrels of oil/day. Buffalo Lake is currently developing an industrial park along Highway 855 and offers significant tax advantages for companies and as such the community is always interested in developing new ventures or partnerships.



Tourism

The topography of the Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement area is mainly characterized by old growth boreal forests and ample lakes fostering diverse wildlife. This environment lends itself well to the development of tourism and eco-tourism ventures in the area. With regional attractions such as North Buck Lake, White Earth Valley Natural Area and numerous other sites, the area is well suited for tourism investment.



Forestry / Construction

The old growth boreal forests in the region provide tremendous opportunities in sustainable forestry. Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement businesses provide a number forestry related services including planting, harvesting and forest management. In addition, our community prides itself in our local expertise in the construction of local infrastructure projects such as new houses, businesses and roads throughout the region.



Transportation

Buffalo Lake is located on Highway 855, a main transportation corridor that connects Highway 16 (Yellowhead Trans Canada) in the south and north to the Alberta Oil Sands. It intersects with Highways 55 and 28, two major east/west corridors serving the oil industry. Buffalo Lake's strong business community utilizes this corridor to deliver services and a labour force to numerous projects. Air Services are provided at the Lac La Biche Airport 30 minutes away.
