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OUR TOP INDUSTRIES



Oil and Gas

The leading industry in the Glendon area is the energy sector. Glendon is located on the Cold Lake Oil Sands area, one of the largest heavy oil deposits in Canada at an estimated 200 billion barrels and borders the Athabasca Oil Sands, which has a potential of 1.3 trillion barrels of heavy oil. Located in the M.D. of Bonnyville where there are over 60,000 oil/gas wells, Glendon has perfect access for upstream oil/gas companies.



Agriculture

Located in the M.D. of Bonnyville, Glendon has access to over \$102 million in gross farm receipts (2016) and the value of livestock and poultry exceeds \$112 million (2021). The region produces a variety of crops such as alfalfa, canola, barley and wheat and the area is also host to multiple livestock and poultry farms. The agriculture industry is operated by both family businesses and larger ventures.



Tourism

The tourism sector is a strong and growing industry around Glendon. Glendon is home to the world's largest Pyrogy and located along the Iron Horse Trail, a 300 km trail system providing family adventure. Surrounded by 15 recreational lakes, Glendon is perfect for tourism investment. Located just off Highway 28, an east/west connection to the large Edmonton market, Glendon can meet the demand for vacation and recreation opportunities.



Transportation

Glendon is located seven km north of Highway 28 connecting Edmonton and oil development in the region. Highway 28 is a major corridor leading east to SAGD projects in the Cold Lake Oil Sands and connects to the Industrial Heartland to the west. Secondary Highway 881 west of Glendon is a major north/south corridor. Air service is located at either Bonnyville Regional Airport with a 1,350 metre runway or the St. Paul Airport with a 1,067 metre runway.
