Oil & Gas



Alberta's economic base is defined primarily by the oil and gas industry and Whitefish Lake First Nation is strategically located in close proximity to the South Athabasca Oil Sands and the Cold Lake Oil Sands. The First Nation is located strategically near Highway 36, the High Load Corridor for major oil development products. Drilling, seismic, and pipeline construction contribute significantly to the local economy.



Service Industry (Oil and Gas)

With Highway 36, a north/south High Load Corridor leading to major oil and gas developments in the Athabasca and Cold Lake Oil Sands, Whitefish Lake First Nation is ideally located for companies servicing the oil/gas industry. Whitefish Lake First Nation offers a work force with welding and metal fabrication skills. Whitefish Lake First Nation is open to partnerships in creating businesses to serve all industries in the region.



Tourism

The beauty of the natural areas in and around Whitefish Lake First Nation make the area a natural fit for tourism, which is becoming a significant growth industry for the region. With nearby attractions like the Paradise Cove Resort, Lac La Biche and Lakeland Provincial Park, there are ample opportunities for outdoor tourism ventures. Opportunities also exist for eco-tourism ventures coupled with aboriginal heritage teachings from First Nation members.



Transportation

Whitefish Lake First Nation has excellent access to Highway 36 on the west side of the community connecting south to Highway 28 and north to Highway 55. Secondary Highway 866 runs north/south on the east side of the community also connecting to Highway 28 and 55. Air service is close by with airports in Lac La Biche and St. Paul.
